Choosing the curriculum that you will follow in Years 10 and 11 is a major decision and an exciting opportunity. It is vital that choices are only made after the most careful consideration of the pathways on offer. The companion "Subject Information Guide" will give more information to assist your choices and should be read before completing the online application. Many subjects are, of course, compulsory and have to be taken. Where you are given the opportunity to select courses, it is important to maintain a broad and balanced curriculum in order to keep as many opportunities open as possible for the future. The good news is whatever

you choose to study, Wolgarston is consistently in the top of schools for the progress students make, outperforming other local schools in this key Government measure and we continue to be one of the top Staffordshire schools. (See School Performance Tables). In addition, the 6<sup>th</sup> Form is now the highest performing in Staffordshire (2023), outperforming all other schools locally including private ad grammar schools, so you can choose options with confidence that there is a successful Post 16 offer.

The curriculum we offer is about more than just exam results and we also look to develop our students to be rounded individuals prepared for life.

# Aim High

We want you aim high so that you will have the freedom to take every opportunity you get when considering which university to attend, apprenticeship to apply for or college place to pursue. At Wolgarston we offer a wide range of courses to suit many individual tastes and needs, all of which provide opportunities for you to be successful and help prepare yourself for adult life. The curriculum process is designed to inform you and your parents/carers as fully as possible about subjects you will study from Year 10.

### CAREERS PLANNING

Choosing your Key Stage 4 options is a brilliant opportunity to refine your learning to suit your skills, interests and aspirations. It is the first key milestone on your career pathway. Everyone will follow their individual career route; these Year 9 options are your first chance to begin to shape your future. You can access first hand advice with our careers advisor who will be available in the library on Options evening.

Some of you will have a very clear idea of a future career and you can work backwards to understand which Key Stage 4 options would be best to take. Others will not be sure yet so it's important to opt for a good balance that gives you the opportunity to study for qualifications that you are passionate about.



The Academic Pathway

We expect 75% of students to choose the Academic Pathway. This means taking the 'English Baccalaureate' comprising; English, Maths, at least 2 GCSE Sciences, a Foreign Language and either History or Geography.

The vast majority of Academic Pathway students will go on to study A levels at our highly successful Sixth Form.

Students planning to attend the very top universities (the Russell Group) will need to achieve grade 9,8 or 7 in their GCSEs. The 6<sup>th</sup> Form offers courses requiring 5 GCSEs at Grade 5 and above that will open doors to the best universities and employers.

The Vocational Pathway

Approximately 25% of our students choose the Vocational pathway. This pathway includes an academic core curriculum but allows more opportunity to develop vocational experiences through a mixture of GCSE and BTEC courses.

Our BTEC provision is externally inspected annually by EDEXCEL and has been consistently graded outstanding. Students can still continue on to A Levels or select from our Level 3 BTEC courses in Sixth Form.

### PATHWAY CHOICE

You will need to think very carefully about which Pathway to choose and the Subject Information Guide will help inform you as to what is on offer. As we cannot guarantee that sufficient numbers will pick any particular option to make the course viable, you need to choose reserve subjects. We hope to offer you at least, either your first or second subjects. If *different* reserve subjects are not identified, you may be allocated into another course with spaces, so you must make sure all choices are completed.

Please note, courses with insufficient numbers opting for them, may not run and students will be allocated a second choice or, where possible, allowed to choose an alternative option. Oversubscribed courses will be allocated fairly.

Please read through this guide before completing the online options form, this is important to ensure you are as informed as possible about the choices next year.

All students have to study the following subjects:

# ENGLISH LANGUAGE &

### LITERATURE

Students will study both subjects separately, enabling students to gain two GCSEs: one in English Language and one in English Literature. The time is allocated to the courses accordingly. Please note that the GCSE English Language course has 20% of marks awarded for Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar and these are vital skills for students to focus on. Students will study a rich variety of fiction and non-fiction texts including R. L. Stevenson's 'Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde' and William Shakespeare's 'The Merchant of Venice'.

### MATHEMATICS

Students in Year 10 and Year 11 continue to build on their mathematical knowledge and problemsolving skills; essential to everyday life and necessary for financial literacy and many forms of employment. GCSE Mathematics has a foundation tier (grades 1-5) and a higher tier (grades 4-9). Students must sit three question papers at the same tier. All question papers must be taken in the same series. A mix of question styles, from short, single-mark questions to multi-step problems. The mathematical demand increases as a student progresses through the paper.

# **S**CIENCE

We offer two tailored pathways for students. Approximately 30% of our students will be selected (based on their performance in Year 9) to study 3 separate Science GCSEs in Biology, Chemistry and Physics. The remainder will study for two GCSEs in Science, examined in Year 11. All these courses count towards the English Baccalaureate and can lead on to A level study.

# PHYSICAL EDUCATION

All students are expected to participate in core PE, providing them with lifelong knowledge and skills in a range of sports and exercise. In addition to core PE, the subject can be studied in depth as an optional subject through either GCSE PE or BTEC Tech Sport. The PE Department will determine which the most appropriate course is.

### HUMANITIES

All students choose from either Geography or History. See options Information to choose.

# RELATIONSHIP, SEX AND HEALTH EDUCATION, CAREERS & CITIZENSHIP

Relationship, Sex, Health Education, Careers and other aspects of Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PSHE) and Citizenship will be studied through drop down days, assemblies and tutor time.

# **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

Schools are required to teach religious education. At Wolgarston, all students are required to study this as a GCSE subject. The course requires students to study world and social affairs in the context of two major world religions. In addition, the beliefs and practices of Christians are studied in depth with those of either Buddhists or Muslims.

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# Types

# GCSE

Most of the courses that students will follow in Years 10 and 11 will lead to a GCSE qualification. These are assessed through examinations and practical work completed during the two years of study.

Most courses are now examination based. Students will have Learning Checks and Key Assessments at regular intervals to check their learning, provide feedback and prepare them for the GCSE examinations. In addition, practical work will be completed in some subjects which is then examined as part of the GCSE and it is crucial that students work hard to complete these to a high standard. Where coursework remains, deadline dates will be issued to each student so that they know about deadlines in advance. They will need to make sure that the work they complete is the very best that they can achieve. They will need to listen to the advice given by subject teachers and be prepared to ask for help and put in extra work.

GCSE examinations take place at the end of Year 11 and test the knowledge, understanding and skills they have developed during their studies. Careful preparation for examinations is vital. Revision will need to be ongoing throughout their courses and the students will be given opportunities to practice effective examination techniques.

GCSE grades are awarded from 1-9:

- The bottom of grade 7 is aligned with the bottom of grade A
- The bottom of grade 4 is aligned with the bottom of grade C
- The bottom of grade 1 is aligned with the bottom of grade G

Note the new benchmark for a "Good Pass" is now set at 5 though a Grade 4 will be equivalent to the old C Grade. As a successful school we are pushing for our students to aim at Grade 6.

### BTEC

An alternative to GCSEs is the BTEC qualification which we offer for Sport BTEC in the vocational pathway and Option Blocks. We also offer Health & Social Care in the vocational pathway.

BTECs differ from GCSEs in that the emphasis is on assignment work in addition to an exam. Most of the marks are awarded internally.

These assignments assess a student's knowledge, understanding and skills within the chosen subject.

BTEC qualifications are ideal for students interested in studying a particular subject in more depth and with an emphasis on practical, work-related application of that subject. BTEC allows students to cover several different units on various topics within the chosen subject. These units are then combined with the examination element to give an overall award.

Art and Nesign

Creativity can be defined as "intelligence having fun" and this is the way the course is shaped. You choose your project theme, the artists you study and the artistic style you develop.

The subject allows you to build abilities in working independently, forming opinions and solving problems in unique ways. These are skills that all future employers will value, not just those in creative industries.

#### WHAT WILL I STUDY?

- Portfolio project- This is a project you build around a theme that you choose. We encourage pupils to choose something they are interested in. You will then build up a body of work around this such as exploring materials, artists and developing your own work. This project runs from the beginning of year 10 to January in year 11
- Exam project- This is the smaller project you get given in January in year 11. The structure is still the same of your portfolio project but you will be given a list of themes to choose from by the exam board.
- Exploring a range of materials and techniques- Throughout the course, you will develop in a range of skills such as drawing, painting, photography, photoshop and mixed media. We guide pupils to work in materials that suit their style.
- Documenting your process- Throughout you project you will document your ideas behind your work.

#### ASSESSMENT

Portfolio project- 60% Entirely coursework based.

Exam project 40%- Majority of this project is coursework based. However this project also includes a 10 hour practical session where you will create a final piece for you project. You will have planned for this leading up to the exam with help from your teacher. There is no written element to this exam.

Health and Social Care

Health and Social care is a popular BTEC Tech Award which combines controlled coursework assessments with an exam at the end of Y11.

Students will need to demonstrate an interest in how people grow and develop as individuals, what can affect a persons growth and development, and what support can be put in place for differing needs in society. Students will need to be able to demonstrate empathy for others and be nonjudgmental.

#### WHAT WILL I STUDY?

#### Component 1: Human Lifespan Development

Learners will explore different aspects of growth and development and the factors that can affect this across the life stages. They will explore the different events that can impact on individuals' physical, intellectual, emotional and social development and how individuals cope with and are supported through changes caused by life events.

Component 2: Health and Social Care Services and Values

Learners will explore health and social care services and how they meet the needs of service users. They will also study the skills, attributes and values required when giving care.

Component 3: Health and Wellbeing

Learners will explore the factors that affect health and wellbeing, learning about physiological and lifestyle indicators, and person-centered approaches to make recommendations to improve an individual's health and wellbeing

70% exam - 35% for each paper (2 papers overall)

Example tasks include a print advertising campaign, pages from magazines, video content such as a viral TikTok campaign, radio adverts, music videos, social media campaigns on Instagram, extracts from a television programme.

Please note that GCSE Spanish is an intense and fast-paced course. It should only be chosen by pupils who are genuinely passionate about studying Spanish and who will work hard both in and out of lessons in the short time available.

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#### ASSESSMENT

The final Spanish exam is tiered. There is a Foundation tier (grades from 1-5) and a higher tier (grades 4-9). Decisions on entries are made after regular assessments throughout the course and in consultation with pupils and parents.

There are 4 exams:

- Paper 1: Listening (25%)
- Paper 2: Speaking (25%)
- Paper 3: Reading (25%)
- Paper 4: Writing (25%)
